

Double Your Career Options - Become A Licensed Teacher!

Teach@Mines offers teacher licensure in Secondary Science (grades 7-12), Secondary Mathematics (grades 7-12), Middle Grades Mathematics (grades 6-8), and K-12 Computer Science. Licensure can be pursued through one of three pathways: by adding our minor, pursuing a Bachelor of Science with a focus on STEM teaching, or through a Master in STEM Education. Scholarship Opportunities

Teach@Mines Noyce Classroom Experience Award:

The <u>Teach@Mines Noyce Classroom Experience Award</u> seeks to encourage passionate Mines students to explore (K–12) teaching by providing paid classroom experiences. Students will spend time in local schools, gaining first-hand experience of the profession, and will earn a \$500 stipend for **successfully completing SCED 262/562** - K-12 Field Experience.

Eligible applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1) Be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident alien.
- 2) Have not previously been awarded a Noyce Internship, Scholarship, or Stipend.
- 3) Are enrolled in SCED262/562 and successfully complete the course.
- 4) Will attend at least three Teacher Education Alliance (TEA, student club) meetings throughout the semester (unless there is an approved conflict).
- 5) Will respond to all emails from Noyce personnel in a timely manner.

<u>Teach@Mines Noyce Scholarship Program:</u>

The <u>Teach@Mines Noyce Scholarship and Stipend Program</u> seeks to encourage and enable Mines students to become science, mathematics and computer science teachers. The scholarship program is intended for students either in their junior/senior years **or** who have already graduated with a bachelor's degree and who would like to pursue a teaching career in science, mathematics or computer science. The value of the scholarship is between \$12,500 - \$15,000 (\$12,500 for in-state/MS students and \$15,000 for out of state students) per semester. Undergraduate students may receive up to six semesters worth of funding and graduate students may receive up to two semesters of funding. Scholarship recipients are **required to complete one year of teaching in a high-needs school district** (last year 164/179 of school districts qualified) for every semester of scholarship received.

Eligible applicants must meet the following required criteria:

- 1) Be a U.S. citizen, U.S. national, or permanent resident alien.
- 2) Plan to earn licensure through Teach@Mines.
- 3) Be willing to work as a science or math teacher in a high-needs school one year for every semester of scholarship received.
- 4) Have completed at least 60 credit hours of college coursework.
- 5) Be in good academic standing according to the Mines Registrar.

The Plutt fund was established for the purpose of providing support for leadership and travel funds for exceptional students with demonstrated financial need participating in the University Honors and Scholars Programs. The fund can be awarded in a variety of ways such as, but not limited to:
